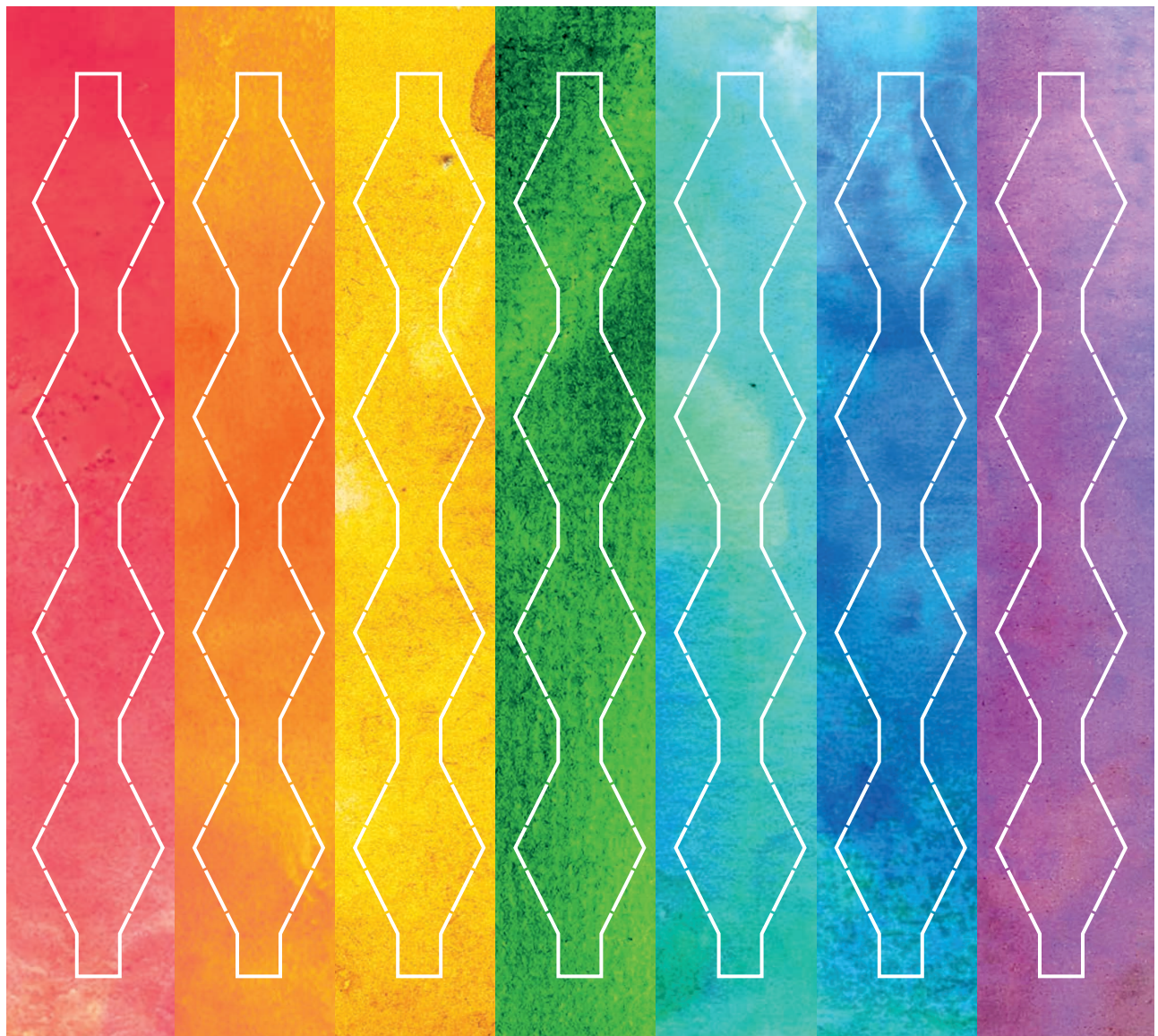




1. Cut out the colored weaving strips along the white lines and lay out the five that you want to use for your turtle's shell.
2. Pick the row where you want to start. Gently push a strip through the first pre-cut slit in the shell going from the back to the front.
3. Carefully weave the strip over and under through the slits. The large diamond-shaped parts should end up on top of the shell and the short, straight sections should end up underneath.
4. When you've finished weaving the row, trim off the excess part of the strip. Leave a small tab on each end. Tape the tabs in place on the back of the turtle.
5. Repeat four more times to complete the other rows.
